The OCC's **National Diversity Internship Program (NDIP)** is a key part of the OCC's efforts to diversify its talent pipeline with the goal of advancing diversity, equity, and inclusion in the workforce. The program provides practical professional experience, development, and career-readiness internships to diverse undergraduate and graduate students, currently enrolled, full-time from accredited institutions, such as, but not limited to Minority Serving Institutions (i.e., Historically Black Colleges and Universities, Hispanic Serving Institutions, Asian American and Pacific Islander Serving Institutions, and Tribal Colleges and Universities).

## **PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

The NDIP offers a ten-week paid summer internship, providing valuable professional experience through substantive work assignments and projects that will enhance participants' marketability for future jobs. The program also exposes interns to the many career opportunities available at the OCC.

During the program, which runs from early June through mid-August, interns will work 40 hours a week at OCC headquarters or a regional office assisting with a variety of projects assigned by a selected manager. Interns are generally matched with a business unit based on their skills, knowledge, experience, and interests.

## **ELIGIBILITY**

To apply for an internship through the NDIP program, students must meet the following criteria:

- » Be a U.S. citizen
- » Have a minimum GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- » Be able to work full-time (40 hours per week) for the length of the program
- » Be enrolled in a degree seeking program (bachelor's, master's, doctorate) from an accredited minority serving post-secondary institution seeking a major or minor including:
  - » Accounting
  - » Business/Business Management
  - » Computer Science/Cyber Security
  - » Data Science/Economics

- » Finance
- » Information Technology/Systems
- » Law
- » Mathematics
